University of California Office of the President, Small Business First (SB1st)

The SB1st initiative offers specific streamlined procurement opportunities to registered Small Businesses (SBs), Microbusinesses (MBs), and Disabled Veteran Business Enterprises (DVBEs). This program helps the University of California (UC) and UCSF invest in and enrich our local communities while furthering our sustainability goals and mission of teaching, research, and public service.

Be sure to discuss where your business is certified. SB1st is not for every type of purchase. You can learn more at <u>UCOP's Small Business First website</u>.

How to Do Business with UC

- Understand the procurement contract process at UC: Read more in the "Get Familiar with UC Practices" section.
- **Get your business certified.** Read more in the "Common Shared Certifying Agencies & Certifications" and "Support Agencies for Certification" sections.
- **Register/create a supplier profile in SupplierOne**: SupplierOne is a supplier search platform that will identify you as a small/DVBE/diverse business to UC buyers. Register at the <u>SupplierOne website</u>.
- **Register/create a Supplier Profile in CalUsource**: CalUsource, UC's eSourcing and public bid site allows you to participate in bid events across the UC system (to compete for contracts above \$250,000). Register at <u>CalUSource</u>.
- Stay connected with buyers/requestors at UCSF.

Common Shared Certifying Agencies & Certifications

- California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC): Under the auspices of CPUC, the <u>Supplier Clearinghouse</u> publishes a directory of these certified businesses for use by participating utility companies and the public.
- **Disability:IN**: <u>Disability:IN</u> empowers businesses to achieve disability inclusion and equality.
- **National LGBT Chamber of Commerce**: <u>National LGBT Chamber of Commerce</u> is the business voice of the LGBTQ community.
- National Minority Supplier Development Council (NMSDC): <u>National Minority</u> <u>Supplier Development Council</u> offers certification for minority-owned businesses, along with business development resources.
- National Veteran Owned Business Association (NaVOBA): <u>NaVOBA</u> provides a direct link for contracting between corporate America and Veteran's Business Enterprises and Certified Service-Disabled Veteran's Business Enterprises.
- **State of California:** State of California's <u>Department of General Services</u> provides free certification as a SB, MB and/or DVBE.
- U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA): <u>MySBA Certifications</u> is an application for SBA federal government certifications. Certifications available for federal contract small business subcontracting.
- Women's Business Enterprise National Council (WBENC): WBENC offers a
 Women Owned Small Business certification.
